#### Introduction

Shine on us, Lord, like the sun that lights up day.
Chase away the dark and all shadow of sin.
May we wake eager to hear your Word;
As day follows night may we be bathed in your glory.

A Psalm: **Psalm 63:1-5** (GNB)

O God, you are my God, and I long for you. My whole being desires you; like a dry, worn-out, and waterless land, my soul is thirsty for you.

- <sup>2</sup>Let me see you in the sanctuary; let me see how mighty and glorious you are.
- <sup>3</sup> Your constant love is better than life itself, and so I will praise you.
- <sup>4</sup>I will give you thanks as long as I live; I will raise my hands to you in prayer.
- <sup>5</sup> My soul will feast and be satisfied, and I will sing glad songs of praise to you.

Illumine our hearts, O Lord; implant in us a desire for your truth. May all that is false within us flee.

## A Bible reading: **Philippians 4:4-9 (NLT)**

<sup>4</sup> Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again—rejoice! Let everyone see that you are considerate in all you do. Remember, the Lord is coming soon.

<sup>6</sup> Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. <sup>7</sup> Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.

<sup>8</sup> And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honourable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise. <sup>9</sup> Keep putting into practice all you learned and received from me—everything you heard from me and saw me doing. Then the God of peace will be with you.

A Gospel reading: Luke 17:11-19 (NLT)

<sup>11</sup> As Jesus continued on toward Jerusalem, he reached the border between Galilee and Samaria. <sup>12</sup> As he entered a village there, ten men with leprosy stood at a distance, <sup>13</sup> crying out, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"

<sup>14</sup> He looked at them and said, "Go show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed of their leprosy.
 <sup>15</sup> One of them, when he saw that he was healed, came back to Jesus, shouting, "Praise God!" <sup>16</sup> He fell to the ground at Jesus' feet, thanking him for what he had done. This man was a Samaritan.

<sup>17</sup> Jesus asked, "Didn't I heal ten men? Where are the other nine? <sup>18</sup> Has no one returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?" <sup>19</sup> And Jesus said to the man, "Stand up and go. Your faith has healed you."

We remember how lovingly you have cared,
We remember especially that greatest gift of all,
Jesus Christ our Saviour,
And we give you thanks.
